### OLD LIBRARY READIED

Through the efforts of many individuals, phase one of making the old Epsom Public Library into its new function as an historical center is complete. The Epsom Historical Association has moved its office and files into the downstairs after the room was painted and cleaned. Working closely with the library trustees, the remaining items left by the old library have been removed and soon the old stacks will be removed

clearing the way to transform the upstairs into a display area for historical items and artifacts. All items to be displayed, as well as those in the files, have begun to be databased and recorded in the new computer system. Once the work is complete, the downstairs will serve as a research facility and work area, and the upstairs will be open as a museum. The completion date depends on the availability of funds and the volunteer's ability to complete the work.

#### **ASSOCIATION TEST**

April 12, 1776

In order to carry the underwritten RESOLVE of the Hon'ble Continental CONGRESS into Execution, You are requested to desire all Males above Twenty One Years of Age (Lunaticks, Idiots, and Negroes excepted) to sign the DECLARATION on this Paper; and when so done, to make Return hereof, together with the Name or Names of all who shall refuse to sign the same, to the GENERAL-ASSEMBLY, or Committee of Safety of this Colony. - M. Weare, Chairman In CONGRESS, March 14th, 1776 -Resolved. That it be recommended to the several Assemblies, Conventions, and Councils, or Committees of Safety of the United Colonies, immediately to cause all Persons to be disarmed, within their Respective Colonies, who are notoriously disaffected to the cause of AMERICA, Or who have not associated, and refuse to associate, to defend by ARMS, the United Colonies, against the Hostile Attempts of the British Fleets and Armies. - Extract from the Minutes. Charles Thompson, Sec'ry. In Consequence of the above Resolution, of the Hon. Continental CONGRESS, and to shew our Determination in joining our American Brethren, in defending the Lives, Liberties, and Properties of the Inhabitants of the UNITED COLONIES, - WE, the Subscribers, do hereby solemnly engage, and promise, that we will, to the utmost of our Power, at the Risque of our Lives and Fortunes, with ARMS, oppose the Hostile Proceedings of the British Fleets, and Armies, against the United American COLONIES.
