



### **Andrew Silver Home, 11 Goboro Road, Epsom, NH**

William Goss moved himself and family to this area from the Fowler District, buying most of the land that was previously in the hands of Daniel Cilley and heirs. According to notes by Benjamin M. Towle written in 1936 "The house was moved there (I do not know from where) and put up by William Goss for his son John who started the store which is now operated by Silver and Young". John A. Goss moved into banking and moved to Pittsfield, New Hampshire. Jacob Robinson, in partnership with Andrew J. Silver, were running the store started by John A. Goss, and hence obtained the house. The store passed to Andrew's son in partnership with Charles Sumner Hall, Jacob Robinson left Epsom and the Silvers retained the house, as well as Harry Silver's house next door. The two Silver homes along with that of Charlie Huckins (Huckin's Garage) were the first homes in Epsom with electricity, provided with a generator owned by Charlie Huckins.

#### **CHRONOLOGY of owners (not necessarily resident):**

Original lot of Shadrach Walton Lot #94 in the third range; Before 1783, Jeremiah Prescott; 1783, Joseph Cilley from Jeremiah Prescott, land that I bought of my honored father, Jeremiah Prescott; 1799 Daniel Cilley from Gen. Joseph Cilley, by will, land I bought of Jeremiah Prescott ;1855, William Goss, Epsom from William P. Cilley, Epsom, 100 acres including what appears to be the property in the junction of Goboro Road and the turnpike, no mention of buildings or cemetery; 1868, John A. Goss from father William with the buildings thereon; 1873, Silver and Robinson (Jacob Robinson) from John A. Goss. bounded westerly on land of William Goss and south end of store; 1875, Andrew Silver from Jacob Robinson, 1/2 of house in the V of Goboro Road; 1967, Ernestine Wilson of Waterville, Maine from Alice B. Silver, widow of Harry Silver, son of Andrew J. Silver; 1979, Glen and Judith Campbell from Ernestine Wilson of Epsom; 1981, Judith Campbell from Glen and Judith Campbell; 1983, Joyce Heck from Judith Campbell, unmarried, of Epsom, land and buildings.

**GENEALOGY:** Jeremiah Prescott married in 1741, Jane Sherburne and had children in Epsom including son Jeremiah Prescott. Jeremiah Prescott (Jr) married Molly Sanborn, daughter of Timothy Sanborn and Elizabeth Leach.

Daniel Cilley was the son of General Joseph Cilley and Sarah Longfellow, born Nottingham, 1769 and married Hannah Plumer in 1790. Their children were: Polly Dole, Bradbury, Samuel Plumer, Joseph

died young, Daniel died young, Daniel Plumer, Hannah Plumer died young, Jonathan Longfellow, and twin William Plumer. William P. Cilley married Emeline Whitney. William Goss was the son of Jonathan Goss and Sally Yeaton, born 1820 and married first, Maryetta Abbott, daughter of William Abbott and Esther Fowler. He married second, after the death of his first wife, Sally Rebecca Randall. His son John Abbott Goss married Electa Ann Carpenter and had for children: Charles Carpenter Goss, Clara Helen Maryetta, and William A. Goss.

Jacob Freese Robinson was born 1844 in Deerfield, NH son of Gilbert Robinson and Eunice James Freese. In 1868 he married Emma L. Durgin, and they had for children: Edith Blanche and Charles Gilbert Robinson. He married second Olive Freese

Andrew J. Silver was born in Deerfield and married in 1871, Juliette Elizabeth James and had one son, Harry Silver. Harry married in 1906, Alice Bertha Yeaton. No children. He died in 1915 in Brookline, MA.
