SCHOOL REPORT.

The school year'ending Feb. 15, 1900, has consisted of twenty-nine weeks, the spring and fall terms being ten weeks each and the winter term nine weeks.

During the spring term we maintained seven schools, but as there were only four regular pupils to attend New Orchard school, we deemed it advisable to close that school for the fall and winter and pay for the conveyance of the pupils to a larger school.

We have employed teachers of experience, who seemed especially adapted to the schools in which they were placed. While our schools generally have been satisfactory, we feel that they might be improved if parents would manifest more interest in keeping their children in school every day, without tardiness, and also if parents would pay less heed to the complaints of critical children, who fancy they do not "like" the teacher. Many of the children of the present generation want to rule, both at home and at school, but it is manifestly not for their best good that they should do so. There has not been one of our teachers who has not been better able to judge of what was best, in every way, for the children than any child in any of the schools.

Our experience leads us to say emphatically that we think the average teacher administers justice more fairly than the average parent.

The school board are glad to welcome any suggestions that any one may desire to make to them, and are ready to consider any complaints brought to them by persons who know by personal observation whereof they speak, but

the board do not consider it their business to listen to idle rumors originating in personal prejudice. A comparison of our schools with those of neighboring towns shows that Epsom is fully abreast of any of them in the supervision of her schools and the training given in them.

The past year we have introduced drawing, and are gratified at the progress made in that branch. We have tried to introduce, gradually, text-books which are up to date, knowing that even the best teacher must have good implements in order to do good work. Within a few years new text-books on grammar, physiology, civil government, and reading have been substituted for the old ones. We have long hesitated about a change in arithmetics, as the Greenleaf series we have used so long has proved very valuable, but it is certainly very different from all the newer series of arithmetics, so we must recommend a change soon, and also in the geographies now in use.

Hoping for still better schools in the future, we invite your attention to our tabular report.
