THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Epsom in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Epsom on Tuesday, the Eighth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon until six o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To see what action the Town will take upon the budget submitted by the Budget Committee.

3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the White Pine Blister Rust Control.

4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the Concord Hospital, to help offset an estimated operating deficit for the year 1949.

5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$688.00 to cover the balance due on the snow plow and wing as shown in the detail statement of Payments, said amount being included in the \$3,000.00 budget estimate for winter maintenance.

6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the reconstruction or repair of the Gulf Brook Bridge, said amount being included in the \$4,000.00 budget estimate for Town maintenance unimproved.

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for drainage and repairs to Sanborn

Hill Road from the foot of Center Hill toward the Sanborn places, said amount being included in the \$4,000.00 budget estimate for Town maintenance unimproved.

8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$619.41 for the maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V Highways, the State to contribute \$2,477.62 as provided in Chapter 188, Part 13, Laws of 1945.

9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for tar construction of the New Rye Road from the end of the present tar construction at or near the top of Short Falls Hill, to the present tar construction at or near the top of the New Rye Church Hill, or such part of said construction as \$1,000.00 will pay for.

10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$603.34 to cover a deficit in the previous year's accounts as shown in the Financial Report for the year ending December 31, 1948.

11. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue as an open Highway and make subject to gates and bars, the road from the top of the first part of Center Hill southerly to the dooryard of the property of Mrs. Eleanora C. Nutter, as provided in Section 2, Part 9, Chapter 188, Laws of 1945.

12. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue as an open highway and make subject to gates and bars, the Nigger Hill Road, so called, from its junctions with the State Route No. 107 southerly to its junction with Center Hill Road, as provided in Section 2, Part 9, Chapter 188, Laws of 1945.

13. To see what discount, if any, the Town will allow on all property taxes paid within fourteen days of presentation of warrant to Collector, or act in any way relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time of taking the annual inventory.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Your local organization to prevent and extinguish brush and woods fires is glad to report a good year of forest protection in 1948. In spite of danger conditions nearly equalling at times those of 1947 when great losses were suffered in New Hampshire and New England, fire damage and loss this year have been gratifyingly low.

With the continuing cooperation of all the people, we can hope to have another successful year in 1949. Let us remember that in any year, over 90% of all fires are caused by carelessness and that all of these mancaused fires are preventable.

Today, we have more slash and uncut grassland than for many years in the past. Smokers, campers and tourists who use our outdoors are also more numerous than ever before. We must therefore be ready for fires which might occur but, above all, prevention by everyone is the greatest need.

A few simple precautions taken by every citizen will help, as follows:

- (1) Always get a written permit from the warden before kindling a fire outdoors when the ground its not covered with snow.
- (2) If you smoke, always extinguish matches and tobacco before dropping or throwing them down. In automobiles, always use the ash trays.
- (3) Report fires and smokes to the warden without delay.

The observance of these and other simple rules will go far to insure safety from fire damage and your cooperation in this way is earnestly solicited.

The increased state aid in Epsom this year is making it possible to operate the schools at an estimated 30% of the town's total appropriation, rather than 33-40%, the range since 1941. This margin, while gratifying, is not enough to make increased state aid inexpedient. This is especially true in many towns in the state where without the boon of the new state aid law, school districts would have been swamped by increasing school costs and an excessive taxrate on local real estate. If a federal aid to education, including aid to building programs, becomes a reality, Epsom's dreams of a new school building will require all possible local effort and outside help to be realized.

The neighboring town of Chichester is going ahead with a new school building. Many districts are considering the formation of cooperative districts with wider centralization. On the state level, an improved teacher-retirement law is only a matter of justice. On the national level, a nation that is willing to spend \$14,000,000,000 for military defense and begrudges 3 hundred million to equalize educational opportunities where burdens are heaviest misconceives the true basis of democracy and defense, which is in the healthy bodies, trained minds, and devoted citizenship of its people.

Epsom is carrying on a complete lunch program

again this year, under the sponsorship of the Parent-Teacher Association, with federal aid, both in cash and commodities. On December 2d, the Epsom School Board enjoyed the hospitality of the Pittsfield Board at a supper and program for districts sending pupils to Pittsfield High School. Also in December, the Short Falls School put on a program and exhibit, which netted a goodly sum. An "opaque projector" for showing printed matter, pictures, or objects has been purchased at a great saving. Other visual equipment could be used to good advantage.

Dr. Hilton C. Buley came from New Jersey to become state Commissioner of Education, succeeding Dr. Edgar Fuller, who is now Executive Secretary of the Council of Chief State School Officers. Mrs. Verna W. Hunt retired under the state system, on account of health, after serving the district as a teacher for more than a score of years.
