To the Inhabitants of the Town of Epsom in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Epsom on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next at two of the clock until six of the clock in the afternoon and at seven of the clock until eight thirty of the clock in the evening, to act on the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To see what action the Town will take upon the Budget submitted by the Budget Committee.
- 3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.35 for the maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V Highways, the State to contribute \$5,002.32 as provided in Chapter 83, Laws of 1953.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time of taking the Annual Inventory.
- 6. Pursuant to the Provisions of the Laws as revised, Chapter 292, Section 7, 1949. The following Article is submitted: Shall the Provisions of Chapter 171-A of the revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this Town?
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$495.00 for the Concord Hospital to

help offset the estimated operating deficit for the year 1960.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the salaries of the Selectmen:

Chairman from \$300.00 to \$400.00 Other two from \$150.00 to \$200.00 (Recommended in the Budget)

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to spend no more than \$100.00 in 1960 to improve the road at the Northwood Lake Development located in Epsom, funds for the project to be taken from highway appropriations.
- 10. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and the Fire Department to erect road name signs at such points as they deem necessary, the cost of materials to be taken from the Fire Department appropriation.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to have one Road Agent, beginning 1961.
- 12. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

The year 1959 was fortunate from a forest fire standpoint. New Hampshire had the best record in the nation. Fewer acres were burned, suppression costs were substantially reduced and damage to woodlands held to a minimum. The record resulted from a combination of favorable weather conditions, an alert warden service and a cooperating public.

Yet, despite all this, there still persists a disturbing note:

58%, or 6 out of every 10 fires in 1959 were caused by careless smokers and debris burners.

10%, or 1 out of every 9 fires was caused by children. Careless, indifferent, thoughtless and independent minded individuals and failure of parents to properly supervise children and keep matches out of their reach, annually cause these unnecessary fires which cost large sums to extinguish and cause extensive damage. The elimination of these three causes of fires would radically change this picture. The rules are simple —

- 1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden the law requires it.
- 2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning.
- 3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
- 4. Don't throw lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes from moving vehicles use your ash tray.
- 5. Don't burn at home Use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Epsom qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Epsom Central School in said district on the 5th day of March, 1960, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropria-

tion of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the school district will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the district the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age, Survivors and Disability Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapter 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$114.00 to defray the school district's share of the cost thereof.
- 10. To see if the school district wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.
- 11. To see if the school district wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis.
- 12. If a plan for the Social Security is adopted, to see if the school district will authorize the school board to execute on behalf of the district the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the district will designate the school board bookkeeper as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- 13. If a plan for social security coverage is adopted, to see if the school district wishes to make that coverage retroactive in effect to January 1, 1960, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$69.00 to defray the school district's share of the cost thereof.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

In September Miss Aphrodite Papazoglou replaced Mrs. Barbara Smith in grades four and five, and Mr. Paul Hanson replaced Mr. Dave Roberts as teaching principal in grades seven and eight.

All grades received a battery of the Metropolitan Achievement test at the end of the first semester, except grade 1, their test is given at the end of the year. Grades 2-4-6-8 have taken the Otis Quick Scoring Test of Mental Ability.

A 21" Motorola TV set has been installed in the Epsom School. This media is being used to supplement and enrich the existing curriculum. The Epsom pupils have been participating in a course of elementary French and in science. WENH-TV, Channel 2, is currently presenting programs in social studies, mathematics, science and foreign languages.

A science cabinet and elementary kit has also been introduced the school as additional equipment. This will be used to strengthen the science program and for demonstration of scientific principles.

The staffing of our schools with well trained and adequately prepared teachers is still a critical problem. A continued shortage of teachers in all areas of instruction and the demand for additional teachers is an acute situation in New Hampshire. A poll taken recently at the Southeastern Superintendents' meeting indicated that there will be needed 131 additional teachers in this area next year. Consequently, the community should exercise every financial effort to retain their better and experienced teachers.

In our American Democracy, the education of our children and the financial support of our schools is largely the responsibility of the local community, however, a few people realize the scope of this expenditure in Supervisory Union No. 44, which includes your community. The following data will be of interest to you:

An additional teacher is in dire need for next year to alleviate the pupil load in the first three grades. It is highly recommended that the district assign a teacher for each of the first three grades. This will insure better instruction in the primary grades and reduce our high incidence of poor reading.

In conclusion, may I say that during my four and onehalf years as your superintendent many changes have occurred. Because of these changes I am all the more appreciative of the constant cooperation given me by the school board, citizens, teachers, and students.

To the Superintendent of Schools:

During the past year, as part of the school health service, all the pupils in the school have had health inspections, which include checking height, weight, vision, teeth and tonsils. Whenever defects were found the parents were informed either by a house call or a letter. Parents have been very cooperative in having these corrected.

A health questionnaire was sent out to all parents in order to bring the health records up to date, so that as complete a record as possible can be kept on each child.

In May a well attended Pre-school clinic was held with Dr. Robert Billings of Rochester present to examine each child and to vaccinate on request of the parents. It was gratifying to have so many mothers present to talk personally with the doctor.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mr. Martineau, the School Board, the teachers and parents for their helpfulness during the past year.


