To the inhabitants of the Town of Epsom in said County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Epsom on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next, at ten of the clock until six of the clock in the afternoon, and at seven of the clock until 8:30 in the evening, to act on the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To see what action the Town will take upon the Budget submitted by the Budget Committee.
- 3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$730.05 for the maintenance, construction or reconstruction of Class V Highways, the State to contribute \$4,867.00 as provided in Chapter 83, Laws of 1953.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time of taking the Annual Inventory.
- 6. Pursuant to the Provisions of the Laws as revised, Chapter 292, Section 7, 1949. The following Article is submitted: Shall the Provisions of Chapter 171-A of the revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this town?
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$420.00 for the Concord Hospital to help offset the estimated operating deficit for the year 1963.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the salary of the Tax Collector from \$400.00 to \$500.00 (By request)
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the salaries of the Auditors from \$15.00 to \$30.00. (Recommended in the Budget)
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to spend no more than \$100.00 in 1963 to improve the road at Northwood Lake Development located in Epsom, funds for the project to be taken from highway appropriations.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$200.00 to be used in the White Pine Blister Rust Control Program. (Recommended in the Budget)
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the Fire Department; \$1,100.00 of which will be used to purchase booster hose, a pump for the tank truck and 1.5 inch hose.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to be put in a Capital Reserve Fund in anticipation of the purchase of Fire Equipment.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the reconstruction of the Center Hill Road Bridge.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 (to be used together with a fund now in the hands of the Elwood O. Wells Post A L) for a permanent Honor Roll to be erected on the grounds of the Epsom Public Library.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to have one Road Agent beginning 1964.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following Trust Funds, the interest only to be used for care of family lots in McClary Cemetery:

\$100.00 given by Thomas R. and Herbert I. Yeaton to be known as the Thomas R. and Herbert I. Yeaton Fund.

\$50.00 given by Adora Kimton to be known as the Irving Kimton Fund.

\$300.00 given by Sarah E., George W. and Gilbert H. Knowles to be known as the William H. and Albert C. Knowles Fund.

18. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before this meeting.

PREVENTION OF FOREST FIRES IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2200 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

- 1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.
- 2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.
- 3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.
- 4. Have something to keep the fire under control—pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.
- 5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.
- 6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to instill in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Keep our town safe from fire.
In 1962 we had 3 fires. We burned 3 acres.

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Epsom qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 9th day of March 1963, at 2:00 o'clock in the Afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to construct an addition to the Epsom Central School and to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$86,000.00 for this purpose, \$3,000.00 of which shall be appropriated from the capital reserve fund established for this purpose and the remainder to be raised by issuing bonds or serial notes.
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

School opened in September with the following changes; Mrs. Katherine Crosbie was assigned to grade 2, Mrs. Elsie Fife was assigned to grade 1, replacing Mrs. Sharlene Smith who had resigned. Mrs. Doris B. Philbrick was elected by the board as an additional teacher and was assigned to grade 5, Mrs. Nancy J. Tobey replaced Miss Jacqueline Kezar in grade 4.

The continued increase in enrollment will make it necessary to add another teacher to the staff next year. This will make it possible to have a teacher per grade. Although this is of necessity, it will be possible to offer a better educational program.

However, it must be called to the attention of the community that the most pressing problem facing it, is the lack of adequate space. Three areas are now being used which were not originally planned for classroom teaching. The lack of a multi-purpose room and cafeteria

has made it necessary to suspend many important services and activities. You are encouraged to face the issue squarely so that you may resolve this critical problem. Your school board will present to the district several plans for additional, and much needed, space.

Through the generosity of Mrs. Edna Clark, who has volunteered her services, vocal music was reinstated in December. The end results are most gratifying to all concerned. The community is very fortunate indeed.

This is a legislative year and the continued increase in the cost of education will be reflected in the General Court. The need for increased state aid is unquestionable. The support that can be given to good legislation depends largely upon the interest and participation of the citizens in each community.

In conclusion, I should like to express my appreciation for the cooperation given me during the year by the citizens, school board, teachers and pupils of Epsom. A special thank you to Mrs. Clark for her contribution in music.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

To the Superintendent of Schools:

In the following report I have attempted to clarify the duties of the School Nurse, and to explain briefly the school health program.

My schedule must of necessity be a flexible one. However, it allows for at least one visit per week to each of the schools in the area, and a second weekly visit is frequently made to each of the two largest schools — Barrington and Epsom. The schedule is set up in this manner:

Barrington — Monday

When a second visit seems necessary it is made on Thursday afternoon.

Epsom — Friday

A second visit to this school would be made on Tuesday afternoon.

Northwood — Wednesday

Nottingham — Tuesday

Strafford — Thursday

Changes are made as needed to accommodate the immediate needs of any particular school. In which case, the principal of the school scheduled for a visit is notified. This makes it possible, in the event of an emergency, for the nurse to be located by any of the schools without undue delay.

All pupils are examined as soon after the start of the school year as possible. Height, weight, teeth, tonsils and eyes are checked then. The hearing test may also be given at this time or be done in the spring. Inspection of hair and scalp is done at least twice yearly.

Notices of defects are sent home, and these children again checked at a later date to determine the number of corrections which have been made. When recourse to the health resources of the state seems advisable, referrals may be made by the school nurse, and she provides application forms.

First-aid at the school is given by the nurse if she is present. Otherwise it is given by the teacher and later checked by the nurse if this appears to be warranted. Also, any child showing symptoms of illness or disease is seen by the nurse if possible. The parents are notified of the child's condition, and it is their responsibility to provide transportation home; although under certain circumstances the nurse may see fit to take the child home.

Home visits are made, either in response to a request by the parents, or when it is felt that a personal discussion with the parents might be of benefit to all concerned. As of December 31, 1962, a total of 101 home calls had been made.

I have been very graciously received by the parents, and they have been most cooperative in providing the necessary care for the children. It is this cooperation which makes a real success of the health program. I am deeply grateful for it.

I also wish to express appreciation to Mr. Martineau, the School Board and Teachers for their helpfulness.
