STATE OF NEW-HAMPSHIRE.

ROCKINGHAM.....SS.

ON this *twenty* *ninth* day of *June*, 1820, personally appeared in open court, *a Judge*, before *me Hall Bangin*, Esqrs. Justices of the Court of Common

Pleas for the said County of Rockingham, being a Court of Record for the said County of Rockingham, having the power of fine and imprisonment, *Jethro Pellingill*

aged *Sixty three* years, resident in *the town of Epsom*, in said county, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath declare

that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows:— *That on the nineteenth March*

1778 he enlisted as a private soldier in the company under the command of Capt. Ebenezer Frye in Col. Joseph Cilley Regt. in

the Continental Army that he was in the battle against the

British Army at Monmouth and that he served in said Regt

untill the end of the revolutionary war when he was discharged.

The date of my original declaration in order to

obtain a pension is the *24th* day of *April* 1818 The number of

my pension certificate *200.053* I have received a pension

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the *8th* day of *March*, 1818; and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale or in

any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to

diminish it, as to bring myself within the provision of an Act of Congress, entitled

"An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the *18th* day of *March* 1818;

and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed. My occupation is *a*

farmer but not of sufficient ability to pursue it

in family residing with me my wife *Eliza* 53 years of age, one Daughter *Ann* 26 years *Joanna* 18 years *Mary* 16 years *Elisabe*

the one Son *James* 7 years *James*

Their capacity to contribute to their support *not* able to render any assist-

ance towards my support *Jethro Pellingill*

Witness *Michael M. Clegg* *Meek*

Sworn to and declared at *Epsom* on the *twenty* day of *June* A.D. 1820

before *me Hall Bangin Judge of said Court*

I, *Peter Colquhoun* Clerk of the Court of Com-

mon Pleas for the County of Rockingham do hereby certify that the foregoing

and the schedule thereto annexed, are truly copied from the record of the said court; and I do further certify that it is the

opinion of the said court that the total amount in value of the property exhibited in the aforesaid schedule, is *Five*

dollars and *—* cents. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed the seal of the said court, on this *fourth* day of *July*, 1820.

I Jethro Pottingill of Epsom in the County of Rockingham
and State of New-Hampshire, testify and declare that in
the month of March one thousand seven hundred and seven-
ty eight I entered as a private soldier in the Continental Army
in the revolutionary war against Great Britain in a company
commanded by Captain Ebenezer Frye in Colonel ~~Joseph~~ ^{John} ~~Smith~~ ^{Smith} Regi-
ment in the New Hampshire Line in the Continental establishment
that I continued in said Service until the end of that War when I
was regularly discharged and I further declare that when I left the ser-
vice I received an honorable discharge which by some means or other
is now lost that I am now poor and in reduced circumstances and
need the assistance of my Country for support.
