DECLARATION.

In order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

State of New-Hampshire, } ss.
County of Merrimack } ss.

On this twenty-second day of January, 1833, personally appeared in open Court before the Judge of the Court of Probate of County, now sitting, John Batchelder, a resident of Chichester, in the County of Merrimack and State of N. H. aged 71 years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated— That he enlisted at Epsom in the County of Merrimack & State of New-Hampshire, the 1st April A.D. 1777, for one month, & marched to New-Hampshire, near Portsmouth N.H. & served the one month in the company commanded by Capt Hayes & Ensign Hickley of the N.H. Militia & dismissed. was stationed in the old Fort near the light house. That he again enlisted at Epsom for six months, in the year 1778 & according to his best recollection in the month of July, under Capt Simon Martin, in the Regt of N.H. Militia commanded by Col. Dente, & marched to Prince's Island near Portsmouth N.H. remained there about one month. There he marched to R. Island and served in said State until the expiration of the six months, for which he enlisted & dismissed at Warwick in said State, during his service he was stationed at Portsmouth New-Hampshire. That he again enlisted at Canterbury in the State of New-Hampshire (being a recruit of Epsom aforesaid) for six months in the year 1779 & under Capt. (Col. A. Kent) in the month of July, under Capt. Edward Russell & Col. Archibald Bloody John A. Kent or N.H. Militia or State Troops, & marched to Providence R. I. remaining there a short time, thence to Tiverton R. I. & served in said State until the expiration of the six months for which he enlisted & was dismissed at Providence. That he has no written discharge from any of the above mentioned services. That he was born in Kensington New-Hampshire in the year 1761. that he has a record of his birth which he took from his Father's manuscript. that since he left the service he has lived most of the time in Epsom aforesaid & now resides in Chichester above written.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declare that his name is not on the Pension Roll of the Agency of any State.

We, William A. Kent, residing in Concord N.H. and Benjamin Gale
residing in said Concord hereby certify, that we are well acquainted with
John Batchelder, who has subscribed and sworn to the above declaration; that we believe him to be
71 years of age; that he is reputed and believed, in the neighborhood where he resides, to have been a soldier of the Revolution, and that we concur in that opinion.

And the said Court do hereby declare their opinion, after the investigation of the matter, and after putting the interrogatories prescribed by the War Department, that the above named applicant was a Revolutionary Soldier, and served as he states. And the Court certifies, that it appears to them that Wm. A. Kent
who has signed the preceding certificate, is an Honorable resident in the town of Concord and that
Benj. Gale, who has also signed the same is a resident in the town of Concord
