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DECLARATION.

In order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

State of New-Hampshire, } ss.  
County of Merrimack.

On this twenty fourth day of July, A. D. 1832, personally appeared in open Court, before the Judge of the Court of Probate for said County, now sitting, *Mark Emerson*, a resident of *Epsom* in the County of Merrimack and State of N. H. aged 68 years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated: That he enlisted in *Hannibal Massachusetts*, in April 1775 for eight months under *Capt. Moses McFarlane* of *Hannibal* Mass. and marched directly to *Cambridge Mass.* & there joined the Regt. commanded by *Col. John Nelson*, then marched to *Wentworth* & it and there served the eight months under the above named officers and afterwards has had no written discharge, nor has he known any person by what name the troops were called, but according to the best of his recollection *Col. Nelson* was a continental Officer — *Col. John Stark* Regiment *Col. Putnam's Regt.* *Col. Richards Regiment* were and were called at the time he was stationed there.

That he was born in *Hannibal Mass.* in the year 1764 — that he had a record of his age but has lost it — that when he first enlisted he lived in *Hannibal Mass.* that since the Rev. war he has lived in *Hewitt & Gilmanton* and for the last forty years in *Epsom* all in *New Hampshire*.

He hereby, relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll of the Agency of any State,

We, *Daniel L. Merrill* residing in *Bancroft N.H.* and *John Ham* residing in *Epsom N.H.* hereby certify, that we are well acquainted with *Mark Emerson*, who has subscribed and sworn to the above declaration; that we believe him to be 68 years of age; that he is reputed and believed, in the neighborhood where he resides, to have been a soldier of the Revolution, and that we concur in that opinion.

And the said Court do hereby declare their opinion, after the investigation of the matter, and after putting the interrogatories prescribed by the War Department, that the above named applicant was a Revolutionary Soldier, and served as he states. And the Court certifies, that it appears to them that *Daniel L. Merrill* late Governor who has signed the preceding certificate, is a resident in the town of *Bancroft* and that *John Ham*, who has also signed the same is a resident in the town of *Epsom* N.H. and are credible persons, and that their statement is entitled to credit.
