State of Vermont On the 18 day April AD 1818 be
Orleans by do for me the subscriber one of the Judges
is of this county Court within & for the County of Orleans
and being a Court of Record personally appeared Paul
Cook of Glover in the County of Orleans and aged
Sixty years resident in Glover in the County of
Orleans a Vermont and who being by me first duly
by sworn according to Law doth on his oath
make the following declaration in order to obtain
the provisions made by the late act of Congress
entitled an act to provide for certain persons en
gaged in the land and naval service of the United
States in the Revolutionary war that he the said
Paul Cook enlisted in the town of Epsom in
the State of New Hampshire in the month of May
April or May AD 1779 into Capt Amos Merrill
company and march'd in Merrill's company as far
as Fort Mifflin in the State of New Jersey where he
was transfer'd into Capt Glover's company in the 9th
Regiment and Genl Poor's Brigade from
Easttown he went into the Indian country at
that time when he was in under Genl Sullivan

and was in some skirmishes where his captain being
"was killed" he was then under the command of Capt
Chase in the same Regiment & same Brigade and
Returned to Danbury in Connecticut and then resided
In 8th Clases Company I faithfully served my
Country against the Common enemy until I
was honorably discharged at Newburgh in the
State of New York on the 4th day of June AD
1785 ~~the~~ My Discharge was signed by Genl Geo
Washington the two last years of my service
I was a Drummer and was so discharged but
My Discharge I transferred in books to obtain some
Bounties lands but never did receive any lands
nor have I since seen my discharge
and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands
in need of assistance of his Country for support and
that he has no other evidence now in his power
of his 7th services

District of Vermont At Enshurg in said Orleans County on this 30th day of June A.D. 1820. Personally appeared in open Court, being a court of record for said County of Orleans (and constituted such by a Statute Law of the State of Vermont, having unlimited jurisdiction, and power to fine and imprison,) Paul Cook, aged sixty two years, resident in Glover in said Orleans County, who being duly sworn according to Law, doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War, as follows; in a regiment commanded by Col. George Reed, in a company commanded by Captain Thayer, of the New Hampshire Line, as by his original declaration by him subscribed and dated on the nineteenth day of April A.D. 1818, and on which he received a Pension Certificate dated 30th April 1819 and numbered 10,018 —

And I do solemnly swear, that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March A.D. 1818, and that I have not since that time, by gift or sale, or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of any act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person for me in trust, any property or securities, contracts or debts due to me, nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed — viz. — one cow — three chairs — 1 Pail bot — 1 six quart bottle — 1 Pewter Platter — 5 small earthen Plates — 4 Tea cups & saucers — 1 Tea pot — 1 white bowl — 3 spoons — 1 Tea spoon — 5 Knives — 1 shoe knife — 1n doe awls — 1 shoe Hammer — 1 Sable — 1 chest with 2 drawers — 1 Hoe — 1 sickle — 1 Sizing & Smith — My occupation a day laborer — and owing to infirmities am unable to labor more than one third of my time — my family consists of myself, a wife named Rhoda, aged sixty two years, very feeble — and a son of the name of Jacob Cook aged twenty two years, an idiot and wholly unable to labor from his birth — I have no income other than what I receive from Government on account of the law passed on the 18th March 1818 and am owing about forty Dollars

I Paul Cook of Flora in the County of Orleans and State of Vermont aged Seventy five years do upon oath declare and say that about or in the year One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy six I enlisted into the service of the United States for the term of three years in Col Hales Regiment ^{New Hampshire line} ~~regt~~ served out the time for which I enlisted. I then enlisted into the same regiment for the term of during the war and served in that and Col Geo Reed's regiment of the New Hampshire line until the close of the war when I was regularly discharged from the said Regiment commanded by said Col George Reed, and when I was a private. I do further declare that I have never received a warrant for the bounty land promised me on the part of the United States, and that the same is now due to me from the United States
