On this 4th Day of July, eighteen hundred and twenty one, before me the subscriber, a Justice of the Peace for the said County of Coshocton, Personally appeared, Richard Drought, who on his oath declares that he is the same person who formerly belonged to the first Company, commanded first by Captain Morril, afterwards by Capt. Center, who was succeeded by Capt. Potter, & in the first Regiment commanded first by Col. Silley, & afterwards by Col. Dobson in the service of the United States; that his name was placed on the Pension Roll of the State of Pennsylvania from whence he has lately removed - that he now resides in the County of Coshocton & State of Ohio, where he intends to remain, & wishes his Pension to be there Payable, in future, —

On this twenty sixth day of August 1812
before me the Subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of
Common Pleas in and for the County of Wayne in the State of
Pennsylvania personally appears Richard Draught of the
said County of Wayne aged fifty years resident in said County
who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his
oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provis-
ion made by the late act of Congress entitled an act to provide
for certain persons engaged in the Land and Naval service of
the United States in the revolutionary war that he the said
Richard Draught enlisted at Exeter in the state of New-
Hampshire in April 1779 in the company of Capt Morrell
of the ^{1st Regiment} New Hampshire troops as a Soldier (and afterwards served as
a drummer) During the war that he continued to serve in
the Corps or in the service of the United States untill the expiration
of the war when the said Richard Draught exchanged enlistments
with Gideon Decher one of the last three years men and continued
in the service to the December following when he was discharged
from service in the state of New York at Constitution Island
that he was in the Battle at Brastown and Morrisena
and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need
of assistance of his Country for support and that he has no
other evidence now in his power of his said services

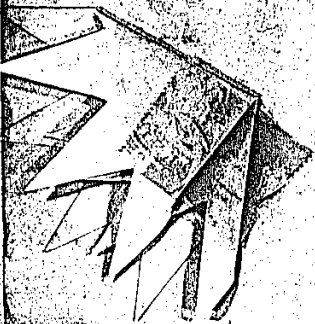

On the 29th day of August one thousand eight hundred and twenty personally appeared in open Court of Common Pleas the said Court being a Court of record for the said County of Wayne having been duly and expressly made such by the Law of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in art 22. May 1820; Richard Drought aged fifty five years residing in the Township of Hartung and County aforesaid who being first duly sworn in open Court according to Law on his oath declares that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows viz: In the first New Hampshire ^{Regiment} and first Company commanded by Capt Abner - date of original declaration 26 Aug^r 1815 - Number of Pension Certificate 15758 - and of the said Richard Drought do further solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1815. And that I have not since that time, by gift, or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled an to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War passed the 17th of March 1815 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me. nor have I any means other than what is contained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed in
