Wills &c for said County personally appears *Thos Phelps Capt*
Dorchester aged *sixty three* years, resident in *Dorchester* in the said State, who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war:" That he the said ~~Thos Phelps~~ *Thos Phelps* enlisted in *1776* for one *year* in the State of *New Hampshire* in the company commanded by Captain *Amos Morrill* of the *New Hampshire Line*

that he continued to serve in the said corps, or in the service of the United States, until the *7th of June 1793*

State of *New Hampshire*, when he was discharged from service in *Head quarters*; that he was in the battles of *and*

that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services. *excepting what is here with written*

That his Original declaration is dated 30th day of April
and that he has received a pension and his pension
certificate is numbered 3,446

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen
of the United States on the 18th day of March 1788 and
that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any
manner disposed of my property or any part thereof
with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself
within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled
an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the
land and naval service of the United States in the
Revolutionary War passed on the 18th day of March
1788 and that I have not nor has any person in trust
for me any property or securities contracts or debts
due to me nor have I any income other than what is
contained in the schedule hereto annexed And by me
subscribed I further declare I am by occupation a farmer
and am unable to do more than one third of a mans
labour as I was wounded in the revolutionary war
I have other information I am perfectly unable to supply

myself by labour. I have a wife aged 59 years un-
 able to work half of the time by reason of the rheuma-
 tism & other infirmities. I have only one child at home
 with me viz Theophilus Cate aged 15 years nearly
 supports himself but no more. & in all respects
 really stand in need of my country's bounty.

In order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress of the third day of March 1843 entitled "An act granting pensions to the widows of certain revolution-
ary soldiers," and

On this eighth day of December A.D. 1845 personally appeared before me the subscriber, one of the Justices of the Court of Common Pleas within and for the County of Grafton aforesaid, Susannah Capps a resident of the Town of Doverhester in the County of Grafton and State of New Hampshire aged eighty one years, who being first duly sworn according to Law, doth on her oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed March 3rd 1843 entitled "An act granting pensions to the widows of certain soldiers" and also the act of Congress passed June 1844 entitled "An act to continue the pensions of certain widows". That she is the widow of Theophilus Capps who was a Sergeant in the Army of the Revolution and was at the time of his death a Revolutionary Pensioner of the United States under the act of Congress passed June 1832. She has documentary evidence to prove his services but respectfully refers to the Declaration and testimony furnished the War Department by her said husband in support of his claim to a pension to support her own claim. She further declares that she was married to the said Theophilus Capps on the 28th day of January A.D. 1785 in the Town of Epsom in said State of New Hampshire by the Rev. Mr. Hazen who was at that time a settled Minister in said town of Epsom. That her husband the said Theophilus Capps died November 5th A.D. 1845 and that she has remained his widow to the present time.
